

CHRIST - OUR ANCHOR

Recently I was catching up with a friend, and we got busy talking about work, kids, and our work commute. During the course of the conversation, she described what her typical work

day looks like. She is a mother of three, and two of her children are under the age of two. Her day starts at 4:45 in the morning, and she drops off her kids at day care by 6:00 am so that she can get to work by 7:30 am. I was curious how she was able to do this day after day, week after week. Her response was "I wake up in the morning, and then I just keep going. If I stop or slow down for a minute everything falls apart."

Later on, as I was reflecting on her words, I realized how true they were for many of us trying to balance work and family life. With all the different commitments and responsibilities we have, it feels like every day we are constantly on the go. There seems to be a long list of things to do, and each time something is checked off, more new items get added. Sometimes when everything on our list seems important and we get pulled in multiple directions, things seem unstable and we tend to get overwhelmed. In such times we need an anchor to rely on - something that will help us stay grounded. In mental health, the concepts of meditation and mindfulness are often taught to clients who need to feel grounded. Clients experiencing anxiety, stress, and worry practice these skills over and over again, till they become comfortable enough to use them when needed.

As Christians, we have the best anchor to rely on at all times. Philippians 4:6 says "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." Christ is an anchor that will never fail. Given how busy life gets, I often use small pockets of time where I can pray and seek comfort from Him. Sometimes it's in the mornings during my commute to work, sometimes it's a little free time in the office, and sometimes it's just before I go to bed. Praying with others is also important. Family prayer, as well as praying with friends, has been helpful for me. Mathew 18:20 says "For where two or three gather together in My name, there I am with them." A few of my friends and I have scheduled a time to pray during the day at work. When the reminder on my phone goes off, I am able to take a few minutes to pray. Even though we are all in different places, just knowing that there are three others praying with me provides me strength.

There is no request that is too big or small for God to attend. When things seem unstable and cause us anxiety, instead of being overwhelmed we should turn to the Lord in prayer and know that in every storm, big or small, Christ is our anchor – yesterday, today and forevermore.
