



Dearly Beloved in Christ,

On March 3rd, we are going to embark on the journey of Great Lent. In the Gospel according to St. Matthew 4:17 (NRSV), it

says: "From that time Jesus began to proclaim, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." The word 'repent' or 'repentance' is derived from the Greek word, metanoia, which more means 'change of mind' or 'change of heart'. One of Jesus Christ's primary emphasis in the public ministry was for the people of God to repent. In the speech at Solomon's Portico, the Apostle Peter said: "Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord." (Acts 3:19-20a, NRSV).

Repentance is key in Great Lent. Many of us are busy or caught up with our own lives, priorities, trajectories, goals, education, careers, family, wealth, future, etc. <u>Sin is</u> <u>not only doing what we were not supposed to. Sin is also</u> <u>about not doing what we were supposed to</u>. We have followed our own ways and desires. The church is exhorting the faithful to reexamine their life's priorities and put their lives in line with the divine plan and purpose of God Almighty. Heartfelt repentance will result in a positive & creative transformation through the power of the Holy Trinity. The Diocesan Youth Fellowship has prepared a Lenten Season bookmark with important prayers, along with a timeline, and suggested scripture readings for the spiritual enrichment of the faithful. Western Regional MTVEA Annual Conference



Hosted by Horeb Mar Thoma Church

Horeb had the opportunity to host the 6th Annual Western Regional Voluntary Evangelists' Conference on February 16th and 17th. The theme of this year was Died for you, Live for Him, based on 2 Cor 5:15. This was one of the largest gathering of believers in a single location in the Mar Thoma Western Region. We had about 250 delegates consisting of 40+ children, 20+ youths and 30+ seniors who attended the conference.



While numbers tend not to convey the complete story, my personal experience being the convener for this conference was nothing short of awe and wonder. In our lifetimes, especially in this fast-paced lifestyle, Christ mandates us to take that pause. A pause consisting of a focused, multi-day experience of great Christian teaching, worship, prayer, confession, alone-time with God and celebration; a combined impact that is hard to describe. Athletic teams have week-long and sometimes summer-long intensive training programs to dramatically move students forward in their athletic abilities. What's true of our mind and physical body is also true of our soul and spirit. We are designed by God to take that pause.

As you may know, the Israelites were told to keep three feasts per year; the Feast of Unleavened Bread for one week, the Feast of Pentecost which was a weekend, and the Feast of Tabernacles which was a week long. During these times there was celebration, public reading of the Word of God, teaching, praise and worship and confession of sin. Unfortunately, the Israelites did not always keep these feasts and their hearts strayed away from the Lord. But, periodically during the years they would repent, return to God and hold these feasts with spectacular results.

We have an amazing Father who yearns for us. It's remarkable how nourishing it is for Christians who practice regularly, to gather together at such conferences and to stay focused on Christ. *(Continued on Page 4...)*
