Section 2 – Short Answers

Answer any four (4) of the following questions. Answers should be brief and to the point. (4 x 5pts = 20 pts Total)

- 1. Write <u>any 5 Work</u> of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

2. Why did King Ahab want Naboth's vineyard and how did he get it.

Naboth the Jezreelite had a vineyard in Jezreel, beside the palace of King Ahab of Samaria. King Ahab wanted the vineyard to make his vegetable garden, and because it was near to his house;

King Ahab was depressed and did not eat. His wife, Jezebel, after learning the reason for his being upset, asked mockingly, "Are you not the king?" She then said that she would obtain the vineyard for him. To do so, she sent a letter, under Ahab's name, to the elders and nobles of Naboth's city, instructing them to set Naboth up by proclaiming a feast, seating him in a prominent place and bringing two witnesses, referred to as "scoundrels" by Jezebel, forth to (falsely) accuse Naboth of cursing God and the king. After that, they would take him outside the city and stone him to death. As per Jezebel's plan, the two scoundrels came in and sat opposite him; and the scoundrels brought a charge against Naboth, in the presence of the people, saying, "Naboth cursed God and the king." So, they took him outside the city, and stoned him to death.

3. How did Gideon select a small army and how did they fight against the Midianites?

When Gideon was selecting people to fight against the Midianites, the Lord wanted to ensure that the battle was not won by sheer strength of numbers. Originally, there was 32,000 men, but that was reduced to, 10,000 and then finally 300 people. He chose these individuals by a simple test of how they drank their water from a river. Those that lapped the water like a dog with their tongues were selected and those that knelt down to drink the water were sent home.

4. In the lesson 'Jesus Walks on Water' how did Peter display his faith in Jesus, what happened then, what did Jesus tell finally tell Peter, and what did the disciples tell among themselves?

Peter asked Jesus if it was truly he then to command Peter to come to you on the water. He said, "Come." So, Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus. But when Peter saw the wind, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, "Lord, save me." Jesus immediately reached out his hand and took hold of him, saying to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?"

The disciples in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

The 3 promises in the Abrahamic Covenant are:

- The promise of Land Canaan (Gen.12:1)
- The promise of descendants (Gen.12:2). I will make you a great nation.
- The promise of blessings and redemption (Gen.12:3). I will bless those who bless you, and curse those who curse you and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed

Characteristics:

- Abraham was faithful and obedient to God, was even ready to sacrifice his first-born son Isaac for God.
- Abraham is known for his blind faith in God.

6. What qualities did King Nebuchadnezzar find favorable in the young men? (2 pts) How did Daniel respond (2 pts)

The qualities that King Nebuchadnezzar wanted was; Israelites of the royal family and of the nobility, young men without physical defect and handsome, versed in every branch of wisdom, endowed with knowledge and insight, and competent to serve in the king's palace;

The king assigned them food and wine from the Royal table as part of their training program. But Daniel did not want to defile himself with food which was not prepared according to the Jewish religious practices. Instead Daniel requested the Palace master to test them with vegetable and water for 10 days and then compare their appearance to other young men.

Daniel practiced the strict Jewish laws regarding clean and unclean meat.

Section 5 - Mar Thoma Church: Our Foundation and Vision <u>Answer any two (2)</u> from the following to write a short essay in approximately 5 or more sentences. <u>*Please circle the question*</u> that would be answered (2 x 5pts = 10 pts Total)

1. Name **any five symbols** associated with the Mar Thoma Order of Worship. Briefly describe each symbol.

Tableetha: It is a small rectangular wooden tablet or board placed upon the thronos.

Tableetha can be used as a portable altar. It is kept as a reminder for purity.

Thronos: The consecrated table that serves as the altar in the Madbaha is called 'Thronos'.

The Thronos is made of stone and is a symbol of divine presence. This is the table,

which is used for the consecration of the elements in the Holy Qurbana.

<u>Madbaha</u>: The word Madbaha is an Aramaic word meaning an altar to celebrate the Qurbana. Madbaha reminds us of the divine presence of God.

Incense: an offering. The smoke from the incense is a symbol of the divine presence. The cloud and incense stand for the invisible presence of the Lord.

<u>**Censer</u>**: Three chains on censer stand for the Holy Trinity. The bells attached to the chains symbolizes the teachings of the twelve Apostles.</u>

<u>**Cross</u>**: symbolizes eternal life granted to humanity through Christ's sacrificial act. It symbolizes light, peace, and the new life received through Christ.</u>

Kappa: vestment that the priest wears during Holy Qurbana and other sacraments. They are made "for glory and beauty".

Light: calls us to shine light the light in a world of darkness

- 2. What are the basic factors upheld in the creed?
 - We believe in one true God, the father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible
 - We believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only begotten Son of God
 - We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life
 - We believe in one, Holy, Catholic and apostolic church
 - We acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins and look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the new life of the world to come
- 3. List and explain the significance of 4 important days of the Passion week.

Palm Sunday (Hosanna): Palm Sunday on the Sunday before Easter, celebrating Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Jesus rode a donkey to Jerusalem, a large crowd of people spread out palm branches on the ground before him as a sign of his kingship.

<u>Maundy Thursday:</u> It is the remembrance of the Passover meal. In the New Testament, it denotes the last meal of Jesus Christ with his disciples. The Holy Qurbana was instituted on this day by our Lord.

Good Friday: Good Friday is the day of the crucifixion and death of Jesus Christ. Jesus died for our sins.

Easter Sunday: On Easter Sunday, we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. The lent comes to an end with Easter celebrations.

Answer only one (1) from the following two topics to write an essay in approximately 150-250 words. *Please circle the question* that would be answered.

1. How did Elijah anoint Elisha? (2pts)

- How many times did Elijah ask his successor to leave him and go on his own? (1pts)
- Name any 3 of the places mentioned on Elijah's last trip. (2pts)
- What did Elisha ask Elijah for before Elijah was taken up? (2pts)
- How did Elisha respond when Elijah was taken up? (2pts)
- What miracle did Elisha perform? (1pt)

The Lord said to Elijah to anoint Elisha son of Shaphat as prophet in Elijah's place. So, Elijah set out and found Elisha, who was plowing. There were twelve yoke of oxen ahead of him, and he was with the twelfth. Elijah passed by him and threw his mantle (cloak) over him. His mantle (which is a cloak) symbolizes Elijah's passing on his responsibilities to Elisha.

Gilgal, Bethel, Jericho and the Jordan (any 3)

Elisha wanted to inherit double share of spirit (prophetic gift) that GOD had given to Elijah.

Elisha kept watching and crying out, "Father, Father! The chariots of Israel and its horsemen!" But when he could no longer see Elijah, Elisha grasped his own clothes and tore them in two pieces. He picked up the mantle of Elijah that had fallen from him, and went back and stood on the bank of the Jordan.

Elisha took Elijah's mantle and struck the water, saying, "Where is the LORD, the God of Elijah?" When he had struck the water, the water was parted to the one side and to the other, and Elisha went over.

2. Summarize Jeremiah's conversation with the Lord as he was chosen. (4pts)

• Name and explain the 3 visions that Jeremiah had. (2 x 3pts)

The Lord called Jeremiah and spoke to him saying "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you; I appointed you a prophet to the nations." Then Jeremiah said the he did not know how to speak, and that he was only a boy. But the Lord said to Jeremiah, "Do not say, "I am only a boy"; and that he would go to all to whom the Lord send, and he would speak whatever the Lord commanded and not be afraid of them, for the Lord would be with him to deliver him.

- 1. The almond tree (v.11-12). The budding of the almond tree announced the coming of spring. Jeremiah would do ministry under some very difficult circumstances. It would not always look as though God is at work. Jeremiah needed to be reassured that God is at work to fulfill His word.
- 2. The boiling pot (v.13-16). The pot was coming out of the north (Babylon was a nation in what is now Iraq). God is saying to Jeremiah that He is going to judge and discipline His people for their sin. God is not going to continue to look the other way. The main sin that God accuses the people of is idolatry. They have forsaken Him and turned to idols that their hands made.
- 3. The city, a pillar and a wall (v.17-19) God doesn't leave Jeremiah to do this ministry alone. God strengthens Jeremiah, so that he can be faithful. God encourage and reassures him again of his protection and to stand against abuse and persecution.
